

Improving outcomes for learners – how to maximise the impact of Teaching Assistants.

This one day course presents ground-breaking research from the Institute of Education and uses the findings as a basis for training in the effective management, deployment and preparation for Teaching Assistants in the classroom.

Presented by Rob Webster, Research Officer with the Institute of Education and Patricia Langley, School Workforce Adviser from Hampshire County Council the course is aimed at teachers and school leaders who have an interest in ensuring effective practice in the management of Teaching Assistants.

The course covers:

- how to manage, support and monitor Teaching Assistants
- the pedagogical role of the Teaching Assistant
- the contexts and structures that affect Teaching Assistant deployment and their impact on pupil outcomes
- significant findings and recommendations of the Deployment and Impact of Support Staff (DISS) study and subsequent developmental work with schools
- the career path for Teaching Assistants, what teachers should expect at each stage.

Participants will receive a copy of the book *'Reassessing the Impact of Teaching Assistants: How research challenges Practice and Policy'* which is Co-authored by one of the presenters and reflects course content.
